Itinerary

Day 1 - Sunday, March 7th 2027 - Arrival and Welcome

12PM: Delegates meet in Glasgow, have an opening introduction from Stramash Leadership, lunch and then travel together to Oban.

Evening: You'll be treated to a welcome reception & informal dinner along with some traditional Scottish performance.

Day 2 - Monday - The Immersive Stramash Experience

Morning: A visit to Stramash Oban, where delegates can observe child-led outdoor learning. Visits will include a tour and workshops

Afternoon: Delegate 'Learning Festival' where we can share our own personal experiences and work with each other

Day 3 - Tuesday - Fort William & Scenery Tours

Morning: An expedition to Stramash Fort William Nursery, which will include a nursery tour and workshops

Afternoon: Sightseeing some of Scotland's iconic scenery, including Glenfinnan Viaduct, made famous from the Harry Potter Films. Including an early evening visit to the famous Loch Ness.



Day 4 - Wednesday - Tornagrain and Elgin

Morning: A foray to Stramash Tornagrain, where you'll have a tour and a choice of exciting workshops to enrich your practice.

Afternoon: Travel to Stramash Elgin, where you will have a tour and a choice of exciting workshops to enrich your practice.

Day 5 - Thursday - Play in the Heart of the city

Morning: We'll travel to Glasgow, taking in lunch and some scenic beauty spots on the way.

Afternoon: We'll pay a visit to a thriving adventure playground in the heart of Glasgow and see how outdoor play flourishes in an urban context.

Day 6 - Friday - Future of Outdoor Learning Symposium and Farewell

Morning: Our study tour opens up to the wider community with our one-day "The Scottish Outdoor Learning Symposium" Featuring keynote speeches from Rusty Keeler, Dr. Peter Gray, and our own Cameron Sprague. The day will also feature a mix of other talks from various aspects of Scottish Education practitioners to policy makers.
